Our schools have always been challenged to keep a Xaverian Brothers education affordable and accessible to all. The pandemic shut down many schools. But Xaverian schools responded to the needs of students and families by creating innovative programs addressing academic, social, and spiritual development. Whether through remote or in-person instruction, our schools were able to maintain their Xaverian mission by focusing on the wholistic formation of students and building enduring personal relationships. Moreover, students reached out in service activities to their local communities. Every effort was made to provide structure and space for active engagement. Subsequently, students flourished despite restrictions due to the virus.

Our history of innovation and ability to adapt to changing circumstances has always been a strength of Xaverian education. Consequently, our schools have experienced a steady increase in enrollment unlike many Catholic schools, which are experiencing a decline.

This past year has afforded our schools the opportunity to strengthen their relationships with students and their families and highlight mission with a greater focus on equity and inclusion, racial awareness and justice.

In March, representatives from all 13 of our schools gathered virtually for the annual XBSS retreat, over five online sessions, to emphasize the significance of servant leadership. For some students, it was the best online experience since the start of the pandemic.
